CRYSTAL FALLS - Edward "Timer" Payne, 72, of Crystal Falls, died on Saturday, Jan. 31, 2009, at his home surrounded by family.

He was born on June 4, 1936, in Crystal Falls, son of the late Clyde and Myrtle (Johnson) Payne. He graduated from Forest Park High School.

He married the former Phyllis "Jo" Bair on Jan. 12, 1957, in Trenton, Ill. and spent 52 wonderful years together.

Timer joined the United States Air Force on June 24, 1954, and was honorably discharged on June 24, 1958. While serving with the U.S. Air Force, he worked as a radio operator and cryptographer, and would obtain the rank of staff sergeant. He served in the Korean War, and with the inactive reserves until 1962.

Upon his return home, Ed worked for the City of Crystal Falls as the power plant operator until retiring in 1998.

Ed was a member of the Christ United Methodist Church where he served as a lay minister. He was an avid Forest Park Trojans and Green Bay Packer fan, and a big supporter of all Forest Park activities.
