



## Josephine A. Syrjanen

October 19, 1922 - October 22, 2020

Josephine Antoinette Syrjanen, 98, of Florence, passed away on Oct. 22, 2020 at Dickinson County Hospital from complications of Covid 19. Josephine was born at the family home in Iron Mountain on October 19, 1922, the first child born to two Italian immigrants, Leonardo and Addolorata (Antonucci) Altobelli. Her parents named her for two Saints: Saint Joseph and Saint Anthony. Josephine was raised in this area and graduated from Iron Mountain High School. She married the love of her life, Leo F. Syrjanen, in Iron Mountain on August 12, 1942. Leo Preceded her in death in 2003.

Josephine was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Florence. She was active in the Alter Society, Ministry of Prayer, Christian Mothers and the Daughters of Isabella. She was also a member of the Iron Mountain Paisano Club and the Finnish American Roja Ryhma. Over the years, she has been very active, enjoying bowling, cross country skiing, reading, dancing to Glenn Miller's "In the Mood," playing cards and birthday club gatherings.

Josephine was an avid Green Bay Packer fan and secured season tickets for the family in the Vince Lombardi days. She was very proud of her Italian heritage and was an excellent cook, baker and pasta maker. She also had an impeccable sense of style. Josephine had a strong faith in God and deeply loved her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren.
