Edward L. "Bud" Johnston, 87, of Crystal Falls, MI, passed away Friday, May 22, 2020, at the Iron County Medical Care Facility in Crystal Falls.

Bud was born January 29, 1933, in Onaway, MI, son of Clayton and Edith (Petersen) Johnston.

He served in the U.S. Army from August of 1953, also in Korea, until his discharge in June of 1955. Bud married Sharon Rieger on July 16, 1960.
