Evelyn M. Lindeman, 96, of Channing, departed on Sunday, June 6, 2010 to be greeted in the heavenly realms by her husband Fritz, her granddaughter, Maria Cambray, her brother, John "Bud" Kramer and her parents.

She was born March 28, 1914 in Green Bay, WI, daughter of the late John and Eva (Lepscier) Kramer. Evelyn graduated from Channing High School in 1932 and attended nursing school until she returned home to care for her ailing mother. Evelyn married Fred Lindeman on June 28, 1938 in Republic, MI., they had two daughters and shared thirty years of marriage before Fred's death in 1968.
