86, of Crystal Falls, passed away on Tuesday, Nov . 5th at her home. Joyce was born on September 4, 1928 in Crystal Falls, daughter of the Late Oscar and Fannie (Palo) Long. She was raised in Crystal Falls and was a 1946 graduate of Forest Park High School. Joyce went on to graduate from Iron County Business college in 1947. She married Edwin K. Salmi on December 10, 1949 in Crystal Falls and they were lifetime residents of Crystal Falls.

Joyce was employed by the First National Bank of Crystal Falls from 1947-1991. In her tenure with First National Bank, she served as Vice President and Chief Executive Officer from 1987-1991. She served as Vice President of the bank board of directors from 1991-2003. Joyce was a member of United Lutheran Church. She was active in her church, singing with the choir and serving as Choir Director for 25 years. She also served as the church Treasurer for 10 years and was active with Mary Circle Bible Study group. Joyce enjoyed singing, reading and going for walks near her home.
