Kenneth J. Stockero Sr., 76, of Crystal Falls, passed away, Tuesday April 20, at his home surrounded by his loving family. Ken was born on May 2, 1933 in Crystal Falls and was the son of the late Peter and Marie (Nowak) Stockero. He has been a lifelong resident of Crystal Falls and a graduate of Crystal Falls High School. Ken attended Technical School and then the Police Academy. From 1951-54 he served with the United States Army during the Korean Conflict. After returning from the service, Ken married the former Marilyn Tousignant on November 13, 1954 in Crystal Falls, she preceded him in death on November 6, 2001. Ken worked as a machinist for several years. From August of 1967 to February of 1975 he was a police officer for the City of Crystal Falls. Ken then worked as a fire fighter for the city for about 15 years until 1990 when he returned to the police department and retired as Chief of Police in June of 1993. He was a member of Guardian Angels Church in Crystal Falls. Ken loved to hunt and fish. He enjoyed waterskiing with his grandchildren and playing cards with his buddies. He most enjoyed spending time with his family.
