“ Larry was a loyal friend and will be missed deeply by my family and me. I remember well the first time I worked with Larry on the Seney fire in 1976. It was the middle of the night, and he had hauled a large bulldozer from Crystal Falls to the fire. I helped him unload it, and I remember him "complimenting" me that it was the first time he'd actually seen a supervisor work. We worked together on many projects over the years that improved the forest fire operation in the UP and state. He had a wealth of knowledge of all mechanical things and could repair almost anything, often in remote locations and under adverse conditions. At his retirement party, I remember telling those in attendance that he could fix anything except, possibly, the "crack of dawn" or a "broken heart," and if you found the correct welding rod, he might be able to fix those too. He was a great friend that wasn't afraid to tell you what he was thinking. I will miss barbecuing ribs, a chance to explore a new trail, or just talking on the telephone about the "old days."
