Max E. Peterson, 60, of Crystal Falls, MI died Sunday, May 12, 2013 at his home.

He was born March 17, 1953 in Crystal Falls, son of the late George and Celia (Mindok) Peterson. Max was a lifelong resident of the area and graduated from Forest Park High School in 1971. He graduated from NMU in 1975 with a bachelor of science degree in education. Max worked for most of his life in the lumber industry as a sales person and lumber estimator. He truly loved his job and working with people. Max was also an avid golfer and was a member of the Crystal Falls Men's league, serving as vice-president for many years. He also belonged to Oakcrest Golf course in Norway and a former member of Timberstone. Max enjoyed hunting and spending time at Uncle George's camp.
