Nila Marie Barna, 87, of Crystal Falls passed away after a brief illness on Saturday, February 05, 2011 at the Iron County Medical Care Facility.

Nila Marie Niedert was born June 18, 1923 in Fayette County, IA, daughter of the late Leo and Martha (Huebner) Niedert. She was baptized into the family of God at St. John's Lutheran Church in Sumner, IA by the Rev. E. Gaede on June 30, 1923. Nila was confirmed in the Lutheran faith in 1936 by the Rev. C.J. Mardorf, also at St. John's. She attended Banks Township (country) School and Sumner High School, graduating in 1940. She also attended The American Institute of Business in Des Moines, IA. Nila married James R. Carroll on August 1, 1943 in West Union, IA. Two children were born of this marriage, Patricia Ann (Carroll) Bonales and Michael James Carroll. Her husband James preceded her in death on June 20, 1990. Nila married Michael J. Barna on May 1, 1994 at the United Lutheran Church in Crystal Falls. Michael preceded her in death on May 25, 2003.
